Which SACRE?

- Newham (inner London, urban setting, Claire familiar with the course)
- Peterborough (city, outside of London, diverse population, Sue Ward familiar with the course)
- Suffolk (rural, less diverse, Mary Myatt familiar with the course)

Practical Matters

- Three SACRE members can sign up per SACRE.
- The financial cost will be £150 per SACRE. This represents a 'Three for the price of one' offer!!
- An expectation that participants would 'pay forward'
- Registration on the course will be online the usual way
- It is expected that members would take one year to complete the course.



Structure of the Course

- Completion of an audit
- Three Modules (roughly one per term, beginning whenever is convenient)
- Each module takes about 12-15 hours.
- All modules are supported with a tutor via distance learning
- Certificate of completion at pass, merit or distinction



Module One

Task 1- SACRE members would be invited to create a leaflet, but the audience would be your own SACRE or local schools. Members would be encouraged to talk to the teacher representatives on their SACRE as part of this task.

Task 2- SACRE members would be encouraged to explore two religions or beliefs that they were less familiar with as part of this. They would also contribute to the RE:ONLINE cafe.

Task 3- SACRE members would be encouraged to do the option where you view the best practice on the NATRE website. They would also be encouraged to engage in dialogue with teacher representatives on SACRE as part of this task.

Two further modules

SACRE members would then complete two further modules.

One of these would be about their own faith or belief tradition and would require them to 'pay forward' by contributing something for a wider audience.

The other module would require them to find out about two other religions or beliefs of their choice, ideally engaging with other members of their SACRE.

Members work might be posted on RE:ONLINE or the NASACRE website.



Suggested further modules

Module Four:

SACRE members would create a powerpoint or prezi about their own religion or belief which could be shared with their own SACRE, online and with local schools. This could include a summary '10 things you need to know about being a'.

OR

SACRE members could create a powerpoint or prezi about two religions or beliefs different to their own. As part of their research they would engage with other members of Committee A. They might record their conversations as part of their outcome.

Module Six:

SACRE members would create a multi- media presentation (ideally a short film, prezi or podcast) that could be used in schools about their own religion or belief. This would be accompanied by a short guide on how to use it. These would be uploaded onto RE:ONLINE as well as being show- cased in a local SACRE meeting.

Module Seven:

SACRE members could follow any of the fieldwork options as outlined in the module information. They might create a resource to use relating to their own place of worship that could be used by schools, or they might visit a place of worship they know little about and write reflections about it from their own faith or belief perspective- again the aim would be that this is shared with a wider

audience. This module lends itself to SACRE members working together and perhaps submitting a 'joint' piece of work that takes in different places of worship.
