With rising cases in Suffolk, Public Health colleagues continue to monitor the COVID situation and shared two letters last week- [one for parents and carers](#) and [one to school and setting leaders](#) about some additional measures.

The letter for parents and carers is to alert them to the additional measures that may be put in place in the event of an outbreak at a school. The letter can be shared with parents and carers before an outbreak so that they are aware of the measures before they are introduced.

## **Vouchers for meals during the half term**

A Red Headlines was shared on Friday 8 October 2021 giving information about the Edenred scheme for vouchers for children and families eligible for free school meals. This is repeated below outlining what information is required from schools and settings.

## **Jubilee Day 2022**

The DfE have reduced the minimum number of sessions for the academic year 2021/2022 to enable all staff working in schools and settings to enjoy an additional bank holiday in term time to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

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## **Edenred scheme for vouchers for children and families eligible for free school meals**

### **For information | All schools**

I am pleased to advise you that the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has now announced a £500 million fund called the Household Support Fund to support families over the coming months. We do not know the detail or level of funding that Suffolk will receive. However, we consider it important to make arrangements now to support families who are eligible for income related free school meals and will underwrite the cost.

We used Edenred to provide vouchers for families for the May half term and the summer holidays and intend to use them again. Most schools are already set up to use this service and you will be able to order vouchers using your SCC funded Edenred account from week commencing 4 October 2021.

We know that schools are extremely busy and appreciate your continued support in helping to ensure that all eligible pupils receive the vouchers to which they are entitled. We are asking schools and settings to place an order for Edenred vouchers for the October half term for pupils who are eligible for income-based free school meals.

What do I need to do?

1. The person who deals with free school meals in your school will shortly receive an email from SCC's Free School Meals Team. This will ask them to state, via an online form, how many vouchers your school will require for children who are eligible for income-based free school meals, as confirmed by the Free School Meals Team.

2. If a member of staff is ordering vouchers for the first time, please contact us by email at [freeschoolmeals@suffolk.gov.uk](mailto:freeschoolmeals@suffolk.gov.uk) and we will add them to the Edenred account.

Please place your order for vouchers, up to and not exceeding the total number of children eligible for income-based free school meals that you have confirmed to the Free School Meals Team, directly from Edenred from Monday 11 October 2021. The link for Edenred is: <https://ordering.edenred.co.uk/Account/Login>

Vouchers can be ordered to the value of £15 for each child who is eligible for income-based free school meals.

Edenred will email the voucher links directly to the families on your uploaded list providing that you include the parent's email address with your order. The parent can then select where they wish to spend their voucher. The current options are Aldi, Asda, Farmfoods, Iceland, Marks & Spencer, McColl's, Morrisons, Sainsburys, Tesco and Waitrose.

If a family does not have an email address on the list you have uploaded, Edenred will send the code to the school so that you can print it out for them.

Please remind parents that any unused vouchers from summer holiday must be used before they expire in the next month or so.

What if I want to buy my own vouchers?

All schools should use Edenred, except for those who need to buy vouchers from the Co-op, whose tills cannot read Edenred vouchers. Please email us at [freeschoolmeals@suffolk.gov.uk](mailto:freeschoolmeals@suffolk.gov.uk) to let us know you will be buying Co-op vouchers and how many vouchers you will be purchasing. Suffolk County Council will reimburse you for Co-op vouchers – invoices and receipts will be required for these by Wednesday 20 October at the latest.

What about children who become eligible after I have ordered vouchers?

Please do not make any cash payments to your families as these cannot be receipted. Once a child's eligibility has been confirmed by the Free School Meals Team, you will be able to order an extra voucher on the Edenred system or buy a voucher from the Co-op and be reimbursed.

If your school has not used Edenred previously, you can start to upload your files to their system as soon as you receive the link to your account and this can be done in batches,

such as by year group, if this is easier for you. Vouchers will normally be issued 24 hours after you upload a file, however, you can stipulate a specific release date for your vouchers to be sent so that parents/carers don't get them too early.

Edenred have asked that you please don't leave your uploads to the last minute as the system gets extremely busy and your parents' vouchers may be sent out late.

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## **Queen's Platinum Jubilee – Additional Bank Holiday for School Staff**

### **For information | All schools**

The Department for Education (DfE) has [laid regulations](#) to reduce the minimum number of sessions schools are required to meet in the academic year 2021/22 and to enable everyone to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen on 3 June 2022.

A change is being made to the Pay and Conditions for school staff to allow this additional day, reducing the minimum number of sessions which must be held in the school year 2021/2022 from 380 to 378 (189 days + 5 Professional Development Days).

Most schools will be on a half term break in the week commencing 30 May 2022 where this additional bank holiday falls. Suffolk County Council recommends that this additional bank holiday be taken on **Friday 18 February 2022**. The reasons for this are:

- the Summer Term 2022 is only 58 days long whilst the Spring Term is 64 days
- secondary schools will begin assessments and preparing for exams following February half term
- secondary schools will be conducting exams during the Summer Term
- the February half term dates are misaligned with our neighbouring counties so this will allow families who work or have children attending school over the county borders to enjoy one day of half term together.

Whilst academies and free schools can choose their own term dates, we encourage as many schools as possible to set this date as this will help us to minimise additional school travel and catering service costs.

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## CME 'New Starters' Referrals

All schools must submit the 'Admitted to the Role' form via the CME Schools Portal for all new 'in-year' admissions.

#### Important:

**Please note that no registration details or password are necessary for using the secure CME Schools Portal.**

- Please note that for every 'in-year pupil' joining your school and every 'in-year pupil' leaving your school, a CME Referral is required.
- An 'in-year pupil' means any pupil starting or leaving school, otherwise than at the beginning / end of the academic year, in the 'normal transfer year groups', for the school.
- For example, a pupil starting in September in Reception Year or Year 7, or leaving at the end of Year 6 or Year 11 would be moving in the 'normal transfer year group' of the school and therefore a CME Referral would **not** be required for these students.

A child becomes Non-Statutory School Age (NSSA), on the last Friday in June, in Year 11.
