With rising cases in Suffolk, regional Public Health colleagues are closely monitoring the covid situation and we are working with them on additional steps that may be taken where there are outbreaks. We will share further information later this week through a special Headlines.

The vaccination program for children aged 12-15 is underway in many schools across Suffolk.

Local Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) shared some information with school leaders last week. [The slides are here.](#)

Schools have three main roles, similar to those in other vaccination programmes:

- To provide information to their School Age Information Service (SAIS) provider on which children on their roll are eligible for the vaccine
- To share information that the SAIS provider needs parents and children to have

- To provide the space within school and time away from the timetable, to enable vaccinations to take place

It also includes information on dealing with intimidating correspondence from, or incidents with Anti-vaxxers which we have included again here:

- We will not engage directly: misinformation narratives and tactics flourish when they are responded to.
- If appropriate, we will acknowledge receipt: if a response is needed, simply acknowledge receipt of concerns.
- If appropriate, we will seek to reassure: acknowledge concerns for wellbeing and refer to the latest scientific guidance on the issue. Some helpful links include:

Delivering an ECF-based induction

The Department for Education has asked Suffolk Appropriate Body to help ensure schools are aware of the following:

Schools are reminded of the expectation to deliver an ECF based induction and that there is a DfE funded training offer available for all ECTs and Mentors at state funded schools. The six Lead Providers are designing and delivering a comprehensive programme of face-to-face and online training across the country (the Full Induction Programme). DfE are aware not all six Lead Providers have capacity to take on additional schools but there is still availability with some of them and DfE recommend schools move quickly to secure a place.

The Free School Meals Portal is being upgraded as part of a wider Suffolk County Council project with the aim of improving the identity management aspect of it. We understand that some of our academies/free schools have encountered difficulty in accessing the portal and we hope that this work will significantly improve this issue when the project has been completed. In the meantime, please rest assured that the Free School Meals Team will continue sending you eligibility lists over secured email and answer any free school meal related enquiries you may have in the meantime.

Inclusion Support Meetings are now available to book with our Specialist Education Services (SES) *as well as with our health colleagues*. Please see details below.

Inclusion Support Meetings (ISMs): We are now extending the offer of ISMs from across all our Specialist Education Services (SES). *We are also pleased to be able to offer ISMs with our colleagues in Health, which will be available after half term. Please check the booking site before half term, however, to book your appointment.*

Our health colleagues can offer a range of support and advice. For example, signposting to information; where to send health referrals; the differences in services e.g., community paediatricians, CAMHS, hospital services etc; advice on how to write an individual health care plan; navigating the local offer; liaison with health colleagues where needed; support and guidance around the EHCP process where health is a principal concern. If our colleagues cannot offer an answer straightaway within an ISM, then we will always come back to you with the information you need.

ISMs are offered on a weekly basis (Monday afternoons and Thursday mornings alternating). You can book a slot from the relevant service according to a learner's needs, (including the new Whole School Inclusion Service), via the following link:

An ISM is 20 minutes of working together with you virtually via a Teams call and is designed to offer early support, advice and guidance. The ISM will be a 'no name' consultation and should be used to support early discussion without the need to refer into a service at this earlier stage.

Stage 2 SEND Support Consultations (Solution Circles): These consultations also support early discussion and early intervention without the need to complete a full referral. They are attended by a range of professionals from *across different service areas*, including Psychology and Therapeutic Services (P&TS), health and early help. UPDATE 2. FULLY-FUNDED DfE SENIOR MENTAL HEALTH LEAD TRAINING - 'first-come, first-served' opportunity

Unity Teaching School Hub is proud to be working in partnership with the Leeds Beckett University Carnegie Centre of Excellence for Mental Health in Schools to develop dedicated delivery groups for our hub schools, establishing a network for local leaders and opportunities for collaboration.

The Department for Education has committed to providing a training grant for all schools and colleges for [Senior Mental Health Lead Training](#). The £1,200 grant will pay for a school leader to enrol on one of the expert-led programmes from designated providers,

including [Leeds Beckett University Carnegie Centre of Excellence for Mental Health in Schools](#).

Their programmes are pitched at three levels to support the experiences of Senior Mental Health Leads from Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced. They cost between £700-£900, meaning that you can use the remainder of the grant to fund cover, release time and associated expenses.
