COVID cases are still rising across Suffolk, including in schools and settings. The enhanced measures shared previously in Headlines have been put into place in 15 schools across Suffolk.

Please continue to follow the flow charts shared previously and available in the key contacts section below in the event of an outbreak. Part of this process includes support and advice from Public Health colleagues about any additional measures that are to be put in place.

Senior Public Health colleagues are continually reviewing the local situation and -based on analysis of the data- considering whether additional measures are required locally. These will be communicated through special issues of Headlines with you.

Bid funding to support with Mental Health of children and young people

Suffolk Headlines feedback

During early parts of the pandemic, we used it as a daily communication. We have used 'special' and 'red' Headlines where there are additional and urgent pieces of information to communicate. Edenred scheme for vouchers for children and families eligible for free school meals

I am pleased to advise you that the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has now announced a £500 million fund called the Household Support Fund to support families over the coming months. We do not know the detail or level of funding that Suffolk will receive. However, we consider it important to make arrangements now to support families who are eligible for income related free school meals and will underwrite the cost.

We used Edenred to provide vouchers for families for the May half term and the summer holidays and intend to use them again. Most schools are already set up to use this service and you will be able to order vouchers using your SCC funded Edenred account from week commencing 4 October 2021.

We know that schools are extremely busy and appreciate your continued support in helping to ensure that all eligible pupils receive the vouchers to which they are entitled. We are asking schools and settings to place an order for Edenred vouchers for the October half term for pupils who are eligible for income-based free school meals.

What do I need to do?

1. The person who deals with free school meals in your school will shortly receive an email from SCC's Free School Meals Team. This will ask them to state, via an online form, how many vouchers your school will require for children who are eligible for income-based free school meals, as confirmed by the Free School Meals Team.

2. If a member of staff is ordering vouchers for the first time, please contact us by email at freeschoolmeals@suffolk.gov.uk and we will add them to the Edenred account.

Please place your order for vouchers, up to and not exceeding the total number of children eligible for income-based free school meals that you have confirmed to the Free School Meals Team, directly from Edenred from Monday 11 October 2021. The link for Edenred is: <https://ordering.edenred.co.uk/Account/Login>

Vouchers can be ordered to the value of £15 for each child who is eligible for income-based free school meals.

Edenred will email the voucher links directly to the families on your uploaded list providing that you include the parent's email address with your order. The parent can then select where they wish to spend their voucher. The current options are Aldi, Asda, Farmfoods, Iceland, Marks & Spencer, McColl's, Morrisons, Sainsburys, Tesco and Waitrose.

If a family does not have an email address on the list you have uploaded, Edenred will send the code to the school so that you can print it out for them.

Please remind parents that any unused vouchers from summer holiday must be used before they expire in the next month or so.

What if I want to buy my own vouchers?

All schools should use Edenred, except for those who need to buy vouchers from the Co-op, whose tills cannot read Edenred vouchers. Please email us at freeschoolmeals@suffolk.gov.uk to let us know you will be buying Co-op vouchers and how many vouchers you will be purchasing. Suffolk County Council will reimburse you for Co-op vouchers – invoices and receipts will be required for these by Wednesday 20 October at the latest.

What about children who become eligible after I have ordered vouchers?

Please do not make any cash payments to your families as these cannot be receipted. Once a child's eligibility has been confirmed by the Free School Meals Team, you will be able to order an extra voucher on the Edenred system or buy a voucher from the Co-op and be reimbursed.

If your school has not used Edenred previously, you can start to upload your files to their system as soon as you receive the link to your account and this can be done in batches, such as by year group, if this is easier for you. Vouchers will normally be issued 24 hours after you upload a file, however, you can stipulate a specific release date for your vouchers to be sent so that parents/carers don't get them too early.

Edenred have asked that you please don't leave your uploads to the last minute as the system gets extremely busy and your parents' vouchers may be sent out late.

Small grants for schools to improve their environment

Learning Through Landscapes is accepting applications to the final round of funding for outdoor learning grants for 2021. The aim of this fund is to promote outdoor learning among young children by providing nurseries, schools and other early learning providers with resources and training.

Deadline: 12 November 2021.

Schools and early years providers have until 12 November to apply for resources and a training session to make environment improvements for the benefit of their pupils, staff, and local community.

The aim of this fund is to promote outdoor learning among young children by providing nurseries, schools and other early learning providers with resources and training.

Successful applicants will receive an assortment of outdoor equipment up to the value of £500, along with a two-hour training session for staff.

Equipment provided by the scheme includes but is not limited to:

- Bird boxes.
- Bee hotels.
- Gardening equipment.
- Pollinator kits.
- Wildlife watching kits.
- Outdoor wear for adults and children.

Applicants can mix, match, and duplicate products to suit their needs within a £500 limit.

Priority will be given to applicants that include children in the decision-making process, such as through a Student Council or as part of a lesson. Projects that incorporate and benefit the local community, such as through volunteer opportunities or visual improvements to the local environment, are encouraged.

Applicants must be employed by the school/early learning provider. Applications from

PTA's, Governors, or 'Friends of' groups will not be accepted.

The final deadline for applications this year is 12 November 2021.

Re. Trading Educational Psychology (EP) and Assistant Psychology (AP) time through Schools Choice

P&TS have been updating our traded offer through Schools Choice over the last couple of months in line with feedback from education settings. For example, we have now added Joint Planning Meetings with an EP and a teacher from the Specialist Education Services and the updated AANT Teleconsultation Service as activities that you can purchase through Schools Choice. These are both effective ways to start a piece of work with our service in order to plan next steps to support children and young people with additional needs.

These options sit next to the SCC P&TS core offer which has increased over the last year to include e.g., co-delivery of multi professional consultation via Solution Circles at Stage 2

of the [Graduated Response](#). Any activity from our services agreed at a Solution Circle forms part of our early intervention core offer (i.e., free at the point of delivery). We also contribute an offer at Stage 3 of the Graduated Response.

We are actively involved in delivering our services using the [Covid-19 Support](#) bid and grant funding. For information about this work please see the [Wellbeing in Education webpages](#). Thanks to those of you who have already sent in your Covid-19 Support bid requests. The closing date for this is on 22 October. There is a finite resource for this bid, and we will let you know the outcomes of your requests in the week beginning November 1st.

In light of these changes and in order to meet our current trading commitments we need to make a change to some of our items on the Schools Choice Marketplace. For example, we will take the ELSA training off the Market Place for the next two terms as we are now delivering this through the Covid-19 bid and grant funding. We will also remove the day rate EP and AP choices. We will continue with all of our current commitments e.g., contracts and day activity that has been purchased already.

We will review our traded activity next term in line with feedback and demand and update you with the Schools Choice options for our services next term.

Inspiration Teaching School Hubs

Inspiration Teaching School Hub has an exciting opportunity to join the 2021-2022 National Professional Qualification (NPQ) cohort!

The DfE have announced this week that ALL NPQ courses are now FREE for those that work within a state-funded school.

Our deadline for applications is Sunday 16th October to participate in this year's cohort.

The NPQs provide training and support for teachers and school leaders at all levels, from those who want to develop expertise in high quality teaching practice, such as behaviour management, to those leading multiple schools across trusts. There is no opportunity for proof reading – your text will be published as submitted.

NPQ in Leading Teacher Development is entirely funded by the DfE for every participant. Those doing this NPQ will be able to diagnose what teachers can do, including professional development, in order to adapt their school's approach based on the teacher's developing knowledge. This NPQ is led by Matt Carnaby, Director of English and Curriculum, and would be great for those who are mentors for ETCs.

NPQ in Leading Teaching - led by Elisabeth Bowling, Assistant Principal at Hethersett - is designed for teachers who are, or are aspiring to be middle leaders. By undergoing this NPQ, you will learn how to create a culture of high expectations across the school, through articulating, modelling and rehearsing practices that contribute to the intended school culture and the responsibilities every member of the school community has in its creation.

NPQ in Leading Behaviour and Culture demonstrates the essential knowledge, skills and concepts that underpin successful leadership of behaviour and culture. It sets out what those leading behaviour and culture should know and be able to do within the specialist areas related to their role and in relation to how to put new approaches into practice. This NPQ is for those who have, or aspire to have, responsibilities for leading behaviour and/or supporting pupil wellbeing. This NPQ will be facilitated by Tom Burt, Acting Principal of Great Yarmouth Primary Academy.

Alongside the three specialist NPQs, the existing three leadership NPQs have been reformed for this year, to a new and more flexible format.

- **NPQ in Senior Leadership:** this course will be led by Iain Mackintosh, Director of Inclusion.
- **NPQ in Headship:** this course will be led by Pete Bloomfield, Director of Education & Louise Jackson, Secondary Director.
- **NPQ in Executive Leadership:** which will be led by Ambition Institute directly.
