Suffolk Summer born children – updated DfE guidance | For information | All mainstream own admission authority primary and secondary schools

The DfE have updated their guidance on admissions for summer born children.

This guidance sets out information about requests to delay the admission of summer born children to the Reception Year. It also includes guidance on summer born children transferring from primary to secondary school.

Suffolk A new platform for collecting assessment data this County Council summer - recorded session now available online | For information | All primary, infant, first and special schools

We have a new platform for collecting assessment data in the summer term 2023.

This will replace 'AnyComms' and will make it much easier for data to be transferred securely, no matter which management information system (MIS) is being used.

'Broadcast Plus' is a part of 'Perspective Lite'. All Suffolk schools already have free access to Perspective Lite.

In May 2023 we ran some short information sessions for School Business Managers or colleagues responsible for data submission. The sessions provided a demonstration of the new system and were held online using 'Teams'.

2.Apply for fully funded NPQs with Unity Teaching School Hub: register now for NPQs starting in November 2023 - benefit from the final year of guaranteed funding for all NPQs as well as new targeted support payments (£200 per participant for primary schools over 150 pupils/£800 per participant for those with less than 150 pupils; £200 per participant at secondary schools with less than 600 pupils).
