## What is the Forum being asked to decide?

1. This is an information paper only and contains details of the submission of schools' block budget to the Education, Skills and Funding Agency (ESFA) and some further updates around funding for 2024-25.

## Reason for recommendation

2. Previously the recommendation and agreed by Schools Forum at the last meeting, (30.11.23) is for Suffolk to continue to follow the National Funding Formula (NFF).

# **Alternative options**

3. Suffolk could decide not to follow NFF and use different rates and factors, however Forum have already agreed to this would not be their preferred option.

# Main body of the Report

5. Updated October 23 census information and associated updates for the 2024-25 Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) funding was received by the Local Authority on the 19<sup>th</sup> December 2023. 2024-25 allocations are shown in **table 1** below.

- 6. **Table 2** shows that overall, £531.6m is available DfE allocation for Suffolk. The % increase on 2023-24 for the total funding distributed to schools is 1.4%. Please note this takes into account the transfer to support the DSG deficit recovery agreed by Schools Forum of 0.5% of the Schools Block. Pre-transfer the increase was 1.9%.
- 7. There are some differences from the draft proforma presented at the 30<sup>th</sup> November 2023 meeting, which are:
  - Primary pupil numbers reduced by 799 (Oct 22 to Oct 23).
  - Secondary pupil numbers increased by 371 (Oct 22 to Oct 23).
  - This has resulted in a net £1.7m reduction in AWPU and the amount of funding for Suffolk. See **Table 3** below for detail).

- AWPU (as the balancing figure) also needed to be reduced to reflect increases from the draft APT in relation to other schools' block factors. Material difference include:
  - £0.4m Deprivation
  - o £0.4m EAL
  - ○£0.1m Mobility
  - ○£1.2m Low prior attainment
- 8. Please be aware that the schools block budget submission isn't until the 22<sup>nd</sup> January. There are still aspects of the budget that are being modelled and worked on (rates, rents, minimum funding levels, minimum funding guarantee etc) which could result in some further changes to the AWPU as this is used for any balancing adjustments. All other factors remain and follow the NFF as the agreed approach.
- 9. All the schools' block factor updates were set out in the paper Schools Block Funding Formula: 2023-24 presented on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2023 meeting and there have been no further changes or updates since, however to re-cap:
  - The mainstream schools additional grant (MSAG) has been rolled into the NFF by adding an amount representing what schools receive through the grant into their baselines. This means funding increases year on year are calculated on the same basis.
  - adding the value of the lump sum, basic per pupil rates and free school meals Ever 6 (FSM6)
    parts of the grant onto the respective factors in the NFF
  - uplifting the minimum per pupil values by the mainstream school's additional grant's basic per-pupil values and an additional amount which represents the average amount of funding schools receive from the FSM6 and lump sum parts of the grants.
- Increasing NFF factor values (on top of the amounts added for the MSAG) by:
  - 1.4% to the following factors: basic entitlement, low prior attainment (LPA), FSM6, income
    deprivation affecting children index (IDACI), English as an additional language (EAL),
    mobility, sparsity, and the lump sum.
  - 1.4% to the minimum per pupil levels (MPPL)
  - 1.6% to the free school meals (FSM) factor value
- A new formulaic approach to split sites, which has replaced local level approaches. Schools eligible
  must have site which has the same URN, is separated by a road or railway line and the separate
  building is maintained by the school and for the education of 5–16-year-olds.
- 10. Annex A shows the proposed final proforma that will be submitted to the ESFA on 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2024. As stated earlier in the report, this will be subject to alterations as this is still a working document. Political ratification is also required before budgets are submitted to schools during February 2024. Officers plan that Suffolk LA schools will receive their budget information for 2024-25 on the 16<sup>th</sup> February. Academies will be notified of their budgets as determined by the ESFA towards the end of February.

## **Growth fund**

- 11. LAs are able to retain some of their school's block funding centrally to allocate to a growth and falling rolls fund. Schools Forum have previously agreed to a budget of £1.780m for growth and £0.200m for falling rolls and this will continue at the current levels in 24-25.
- 12. The growth fund is used to support:
  - growth in pre-16 pupil numbers to meet basic need pressures.
  - additional classes needed to meet the infant class size regulation.
  - and meet the costs of new schools.

# **Falling Rolls fund**

- 13. LAs are also able to retain funding centrally to support schools currently experiencing falling rolls. The purpose of this fund is to provide financial support to schools where there is a temporary fall in pupil numbers, but numbers are forecast to recover back to previous levels within 3 years. The funding is designed to support schools to avoid the need to take costly actions to reduce their capacity when demographic data shows capacity will recover in the near future.
- 14. The fund cannot be used to prop up unpopular or failing schools. Schools Forum agreed to Suffolk introducing a small falling rolls fund at the meeting of 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022.
