

Overview of Changes from April 2024

Guidance Notes for Registered Provider Portal Users

In April 2024 the funding entitlements changed. 15 'expanded' hours per week are available for eligible 2-year-olds from working parent families. As of September 2024, children aged 9-months+ will also be entitled to 15 'expanded' hours per week if eligible.

Early Years Pupil Premium and Disability Access Funding are available for all eligible children (9 months – 4 years old).

Please see below for an overview of the changes that have come into effect, and how this looks on the Provider Portal.

- Funded Refers to the 'Funded' 15 hours per week that some 2-year-olds are entitled to if they qualify under the
- disadvantaged/non-economic criteria. They will have 'TYF' reference code from Suffolk County Council.
- Universal Refers to the 'Universal' 15 hours per week that all 3- and 4-year-olds are entitled to.
- **Expanded** Refers to the 'Expanded' 15 hours per week that some 9-month-old 2-year-olds are entitled to if their parent/carer(s) qualify under the working parent family criteria. They will have an 11-digit number code from Childcare Choices.
- Extended Refers to the 'Extended' 15 hours per week that some 3- and 4-year-olds are entitled to (giving them 30 hours per week) if their parent/carer(s) qualify under the working parent family criteria. They will have an 11-digit number code from Childcare Choices.



Running Checks on Expanded Hours Codes

The process of checking an 'expanded' hours code is the same as checking an 'extended' hours (30-hours) code. Please see further guidance on Suffolk Learning: Expanded/Extended Hours Checker Guidance – Suffolk Learning

9-month-old – 2-year-old children who qualify under the expanded entitlement will have two symbols in their 'Funding' column on your headcount task:

- EH Means the child is eligible for 'expanded' hours, and you can enter these into the 'Expanded/Extended' hours columns. If this symbol does not appear, and the 'Expanded/Extended' hours columns are unavailable, then it means the code has not been checked yet/has not been linked properly, or it means the code is not valid due to the start/end date.
- **Blue N** Means the child is not eligible for 'funded' hours, as they do not qualify for 2 Year Old Funding via the disadvantaged/non-economic criteria. The 'Funded/Universal' hours columns will not be available to be populated.



Applying for Disability Access Funding (DAF)

From April 2024, eligible funded 2-year-olds can receive the DAF. From September 2024, this will apply to children aged 9-months-old.

Applying for Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP)

From April 2024, eligible funded 2-year-olds can receive EYPP. From September 2024, this will apply to children aged 9-months-old.

The process of applying for EYPP is the same:

- Adding parent/carer details to the headcount task so that economic EYPP checks can be carried out.
- Selecting non-economic EYPP criteria using the drop-down under the 'Stretched/Non-Economic' column on headcount task.
