- <u>SEND Support Consultations / Solution Circles</u> are available from SES and from the Psychology and Therapeutic Services by emailing <u>sencosupport@suffolk.gov.uk</u> These are <u>multi-professional</u> virtual meetings designed to support <u>early intervention and where a multi team of</u> <u>professionals is needed</u>. Various dates throughout the year are available.

SES Core Referrals from September 2024

Four options are now available as follows and are available for Suffolk Specialist Unit Settings either at setting or pupil level. Please note that accepted referrals may result in multiple SES services working jointly with you, where this is considered appropriate.

 SES referrals - school focus (core offer): Referrals should be requested via the <u>School Support Referral Form</u> and should be sent to <u>SESReferrals@suffolk.gov.uk</u>.

This will be for requests for Cognition and Learning, SpLD, Communication and Interaction, the Speech, Language and Communication Needs (SLCN) service, SEMH and the Whole School Inclusion Service. The focus of our joint working with you will be at whole school level; *looking at the universal and targeted provision across the school* for learners with SEND across the identified broad area(s) of need.

We can support with all aspects of whole school policy and practice around **SEND** and Inclusion. This includes support for the leadership of SEND, including support for pastoral teams and SENCos.

- 2) SES Referrals (core offer) for SENCo support includes support for those colleagues new to the SENCo role, new to Suffolk, returning to the SENCo role and support with VSEND and the Suffolk Inclusion Toolkit (SIT). Please use the School Support Referral form.
- 3) SES referrals (core offer) for individual pupils without an EHCP Referrals should be requested from September 2024 via the 'bespoke pupil referral form'.
 - The form should be completed, with parental permission provided, and should be sent to SESReferrals@suffolkgov.uk.
- 4) SES referrals (core offer) for individual pupils with an EHCP From September 2024 all requests for support around all pupils with an EHCP will continue to be via the Section F Request Form. The Section F Request Form should be completed, with parental permission provided, and should be sent to SESReferrals@suffolkgov.uk

The form should be used to request support from SES around implementation of the educational provision outlined in Section F of a pupil's EHCP. This request may not result in sustained SES input and nor will it *directly* provide from SES any of the provision outlined in Section F. The support and intervention (including the length and type) provided will be based on the bespoke needs described.

Please note - Referrals for Sensory/Physical (HI, VI, MSI and SpLSA services) and the Alternative Tuition Service (ATS) remain as they are now.

The Inclusion Referral Form should still be used for the Alternative Tuition Service (ATS), IYFAP, Permanent Exclusions and requests for Reception / Key Stage 1 Specialist Unit provision. Important update: **From September 2024**, we (SES) are again **visiting every mainstream school** in Suffolk. This is in addition to all of the current support outlined above but allows us a 'contact point' twice a year with you to support any signposting and to help with any questions you may have throughout the academic year. If during and after the visit, and in discussion with you, we can help with any immediate actions or signposting to specific teams we will do so, for example with any concerns relating to attendance.

The colleagues assigned to your school will liaise with you regarding dates for visits each term. *Please note that support from SES is available outside of these meetings.* You do not need to wait for your visit to access the support outlined and described throughout this document.

and guidance from across the multi-agency teams within the community and working across the SEND system.
